Riverdale RiverFest



his past June we celebrated our seventh annual Riverdale RiverFest. Despite the inclement weather this year there was a fantastic turnout. There were performances from local bands like Seeing Voices and The Traveling Jewberrys as well as from the internationally known group Orleans. There were tons of exhibitions from local artists, businesses, schools, and not-for-profits, and great food and drinks from local restaurants. Riverdale RiverFest continues to be very important to the initiative to Build it Now!, the slogan adopted to refer to the push to build and create waterfront access in the Northwest Bronx. It is thanks to the "advocacy of so many

dedicated community leaders, and the role KRVC has played in fueling the momentum for the Greenway, significant progress has taken place this year" according to KRVC team member Cliff Stanton. And this success will continue. As reported in a prior newsletter, State Senator Jeff Klein has funded a feasibility study of

several design alternatives with the MTA, a first and important step in the building of the Greenway. Earlier in 2016 Councilmember Andrew Cohen presented a resolution to the New York City Council, advocating for the creation of the Hudson River Greenway in the Bronx. This year's RiverFest continued to represent the communities growing desire for waterfront access. It is thanks to the hard work of so many volunteers that have made RiverFest an iconic annual celebration of our river, the Hudson River Greenway will happen. It's merely a question of how and when. n July, KRVC held our sixth annual outdoor movie in Seton Park. Once again, the park was jam-packed with community members gathered to see a great family movie. We showed Minions. North Riverdale Merchants Streetscape

arlier this month KRVC had the pleasure of having local lawyer and activist Chris Rizzo give a presentation on the North Riverdale Merchants Association's plan to beautify the streetscapes of Riverdale. This includes North Riverdale, South Riverdale, Mosholu Avenue, and Broadway (from West 242nd St. to the City Line.)

It's called "The Smart Growth Plan," and it aims to push forward changes in street geometry; meaning crosswalk safety improvements, turn lane modification, raised landscape medians in some areas, and loading zones and bus lanes. As well as pocket parks, better street lights, landscaping, and pedestrian accessibility to Metro North Railway's Riverdale Station and the NYC Subway. The Association is also proposing signage to better indicate private property and storefronts in the local business districts.

The goal is to make the streets of Riverdale safer, more aesthetically pleasing, and to encourage private property owners to improve their businesses, buildings and homes.

KRVC Launches new Hire Local! Work Local! Initiative

ith unemployment rates continuously falling, State Senator Jeff Klein has partnered with the Kingsbridge-Riverdale-Van Cortlandt Development Corporation (KRVC) to launch a new "Hire Local! Work Local!" program, to help everyone in the community find work.

The result of funding from Senator Klein, KRVC has already helped local residents with securing work in the short-term and part-time ranges, and even as consultants on various KRVC events and special projects.




